That SIPO will give drive, discipline and rigour to our investment decisions as the Board moves forward. We have a balance sheet that does give us the opportunity to look at property investments outside of the greater Canterbury area in order to diversify and de-risk our portfolio. We are currently undertaking work in that area and look forward to the opportunities.

We are concluding a significant body of work that is ongoing on our Grants Policy and we will have approximately \$600,000 available to grant.

We are focused on understanding the needs within our community and ensuring our grants effectively address them. Our objectives include: how to target and grant to that need; how to commit to organisations by possible one-to-five-year grants; and how to measure the results of our grants.

Through these efforts, we aim to make a meaningful and lasting difference in the community and our expectation is that this work should be completed by March 2025. Therefore guiding granting decisions moving forward.



In 2024 we welcomed to our Board as an Observer Director, Sarah Colcord. An observer role is one where we seek to grow governance and leadership training within our community. Sarah already has significant governance exposure.

She was the youngest councillor on the Auckland City Council for three years and she survived! We are pleased to have her onboard and look forward to working with her.



We also welcomed Maddie Page from Ashburton College to our Lion Foundation Grants Committee. Maddie replaces Josh Jones who has moved on from Ashburton College.

A young perspective in grant-making is invaluable, ensuring our grants remain relevant, forward-thinking, and aligned with the evolving needs of those we aim to support.

To Rob Reid, our CEO, continues to make me and the Board look good! He undertakes excellent work, so Rob, thank you.

Finally, to my Board, thank you for another year's hard work. I value all your input. We debate well and are able to reach consensus decisions.

### Financial Performance



The annual report of the Braided Rivers Community Trust group incorporates the Braided Rivers Community Trust(BRCT) and Somerset Ashburton Trust(SAT). In order to reduce overhead costs we wound up Somerset Ashburton Ltd in March 2024.

Despite BRCT reporting a loss in 2024 the group still reported a bottom line profit of \$435k before granting.

Our share and bond portfolio returned 13.8%, reached \$6.2m and accounted for 40% of BRCT's net assets at balance date.

During the past financial year BRCT accounted for \$1.2m of downward property revaluations, the impact of which was partly offset by a return of \$713k from our investment portfolio.

We granted \$84k from BRCT and \$99k from the group in the year to March 2024. The BRCT group balance sheet is very strong with little debt which leaves opportunities for growth.
